

JACQUELYNE GRIMSHAW



Jacky Grimshaw is Vice President for Policy, Transportation and Community Development for the Center for Neighborhood Technology. She is responsible for the Center's programs in these areas. Since 1994, she has overseen the development of the Center's capacity to engage in transportation research and policy development, conduct air quality modeling, GIS mapping, creation of public involvement tools and community economic development. She supervised the development of the Center's Walker's Win! program. She is a national leader in the development of progressive transportation policy and participated with STPP in the reauthorization of ISTEA, TEA 21, and SAFETEA LU.

In Chicago, she organized a Citizens' Leadership Commission of over 190 groups with the charge of developing public consensus for Long-Range Transportation Plans with sustainable transportation options. She developed the Chicago Transit Authority's university transit pass initiative, the largest such program in the U.S. She is a member of the Chicago area MPO's various Task Forces including co-chairing the Community Mobility Task Force that deals with environmental justice (EJ) issues. Now a member of the regional planning agency's Human Services Committee. Jacky chairs the Transportation Research Board's Committee on Environmental Justice in Transportation and is a member of Committee on Women's Issues in Transportation. She is the Board Vice Chair of the Congress for the New Urbanism, a founding Member of the Board of Smart Growth America, and was appointed by the Governor as a member of the Illinois Growth Task Force. For the City of Chicago, Jacky served as director of intergovernmental relations, and later as Deputy Treasurer.
