

JOEL ROGERS, DIRECTOR



Joel Rogers is Professor of Law, Political Science, and Sociology at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and Director of COWS, a national research center and field laboratory for high-road state policy. Rogers has written widely on American politics and public policy, including such books as *On Democracy*, *Right Turn*, *Metro Futures*, *Working Capital*, *The Forgotten Majority (Why the White Working Class Still Matters)*, and *What Workers Want*. He is also a longtime social activist and entrepreneur, having helped launch many public interest organizations before State Innovation (most recently the Apollo Alliance, of which he was co-founder and first chair). A contributing editor at *The Nation* and *Boston Review*, Rogers has received numerous academic honors and a MacArthur Foundation “genius” fellowship. *Newsweek* has identified him as one of the 100 Americans most likely to affect U.S. politics and culture in the 21st century.
